1. Pastoral Support	Two pastoral learning mentors to work closely with all children with social and emotional need. Access to and training in the Thrive Approach to support pupils social and emotional needs.	£42,963	Barriers to learning and progress that are a result of children's social and emotional needs are reduced / eliminated.	As a result, there are clear assessments of each child's needs, targeted plans for interventions (individual, group or whole class) and a clearer and more consistent understanding of all staff of how to overcome barriers to learning due to vital neurological pathways not being formed at the necessary age and stage for each child.
2. Family Support	The school has a dedicated Parent Support Advisor working part-time.	£8701	To support families in improving outcomes for their children.	Parents can access discrete and sensitive support that helps them to addresses issues having an impact on their children's learning outcomes. Social issues that have a direct impact on learning are reduced or eliminated.
3. Free School Meals for eligible pupils	All children eligible for free school meals at Y3,4,5 & 6 have costs met by the school out of the PP Grant.	£6489	PP children should not be at a detriment in their learning due to lack of a healthy balanced diet.	Children benefit from regular, nutritionally balanced meals to support their healthy development. This will support their learning in many ways.
4. Attendance Consultant	Outside expertise bought in to support the school in close scrutiny of attendance information.	£1625	PP children should not be at a detriment in their learning due to attendance issues.	Particular focus is given to identifying areas of concern that relate to children eligible for the PP grant support. Close liaison with members of the pastoral team ensures that all attendance issues are addressed and children do not get overlooked due to being off from school.

5. Teaching, Learning and Assessment Support	Outside expertise bought in to support the school with teaching, learning and assessment and relevant data.	£14477	Additional expertise used to provide specific staff CPD around high quality teaching and learning. Also used to support data analysis, development of school systems and pupil progress.	Staff have benefited from specific school-based development activities to improve the quality of teaching, learning and assessment. Pupil progress is supported through additional input specifically around PP children. Overall, a tighter and more rigorous quality assurance system has been developed.
