<b>1. Pastoral Support</b>	Two pastoral learning mentors who work using the Thrive Approach to support pupils social and emotional needs.	£34778	Barriers to learning and progress that are a result of children's social and emotional needs are reduced / eliminated.	As a result, there are clear assessments of each child's needs, targeted plans for interventions (individual, group or whole class) and a clearer and more consistent understanding of all staff of how to overcome barriers to learning due to vital neurological pathways not being formed at the necessary age and stage for each child.
<b>2. Family Support</b>	The school has a dedicated Parent Support Advisor working part-time.	£9500	To support families in improving outcomes for their children.	Parents can access discrete and sensitive support that helps them to address issues having an impact on their children's learning outcomes. Social issues that have a direct impact on learning are reduced or eliminated.
<b>3. Additional learning interventions</b>	Additional staffing to support different strategies to address gaps in children's learning.	£34511	PP children who are not at the expected stage of learning for their age will receive additional support to help reduce gaps in their learning with that of other children.	Small group teaching for daily mathematics lessons in Y5 & Y6 Additional adult input to improve children's language acquisition and control in the EYFS and Y1. As a result, the gaps in learning are closing.

<b>4. Free School Meals for eligible pupils</b>	All children eligible for free school meals at Y3,4,5 & 6 have costs met by the school out of the PP Grant.	£4442	PP children should not be at a detriment in their learning due to lack of a healthy balanced diet.	Children benefit from regular, nutritionally balanced meals to support their healthy development. This will support their learning in many ways.
<b>5. Attendance Consultant</b>	Outside expertise bought in to support the school in close scrutiny of attendance information.	£1750	PP children should not be at a detriment in their learning due to attendance issues.	Particular focus is given to identifying areas of concern that relate to children eligible for the PP grant support. Close liaison with members of the pastoral team ensures that all attendance issues are addressed and children do not get overlooked due to being off from school.
