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What is the PE & Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2014 – 2020 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2016 to 2017 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

We believe that a school with a strong positive culture towards children's physical development and sporting attitudes enables and encourages all children to grow and develop themselves healthily and to play and enjoy sport. We look to ensure that high quality provision for all children's physical development including in PE and sport, is being delivered at all times which alongside our wider curriculum provision ensures that our children lead happy and healthy lives
